

WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES REGULAR MEETING
HELD Thursday, August 3, 2023 7:30pm

Meeting was called to order by Mr. Robert Entenmann. All members were present except Mr. Dave Yoder. Also present were Fiscal Officer, Annette Depue Road Superintendent, Mr. Andy Romoser, and Zoning Inspector, Tim Boggs. Mr. Jack Butler made a motion to waive the reading of the minutes and to pay the bills, approve Purchase Orders, & approve reallocations as presented. Mr. Robert Entenmann seconded the motion and the motion carried with a roll call vote of all ayes.

Mr. Romoser reported that the total cost of the guardrail project was \$89,379.60 and that OPWC paid half and we paid our half as well. Mr. Romoser requested 3 quotes to fix Sid Hall's drainage issue at 774 Walnut Drive N. He only received one back for \$3,200 from Yarger's Forestry Mulching Services. Mr. Robert Entenmann made a motion to accept the quote and Mr. Butler seconded the motion. Mr. Romoser also submitted the quote received from Servinsky Engineering services for the salt shed. Mr. Robert Entenmann made a motion to move forward and Mr. Butler seconded, and the motion carried with a roll call vote of all ayes.

Resident, Bill Anders of 91 Deerfield Drive attended the meeting to ask about the construction of the new fire station. He also inquired to see if there are any positions available in the road department.

Mr. Tim Boggs reported that he has been investigating permit prices in surrounding townships. We are nearly half the price of Mifflin and Monroe. In order to increase our price, we will need to pass a resolution. Trustees requested that more research should be done before a final decision is made. 1060 Lexwood received a 3rd complaint and the trustees still it is not a nuisance. 2627 Walnut Drive has been reported to have chickens, it is still being investigated. Mr. Boggs is still waiting for a reply from Mr. Burton in regards 2651 Lexington Avenue and on the solar panel zoning requirements.

Fiscal Officer, Annette Depue presented the cash summary by fund report

Mr. Jack Butler received another call about the aggregate. There are some billing issues and Mr. Entenmann reported that they are being taken care of. Mr. Butler also reported that he spoke with Josh from Studer/Obringer in regards to setting propane tanks at the new building site so there can be heat for winter construction.

After no further business, Mr. Jack Butler made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Robert Entenmann seconded the motion and the motion carried with the meeting ending at 8:19 pm.
